WATERBASED GYM FLOOR CLEANER

DESCRIPTION

Gym Floor Cleaner is used to clean prior to recoating wood floors, as well as for general maintenance cleaning. It has been specifically formulated to remove oils found in dust mop treatments, skin oils, and cosmetics, which will make a gym floor slippery and interfere with bonding of fresh finish coats.

METHOD OF APPLICATION

FOR CLEANING PRIOR TO COATING - GFC should be used when a waterborne finish is being applied. It will remove oil residues which could cause adhesion problems. If the floor has been waxed, it will be necessary to sand before recoating. GFC can also be used on synthetic gym floors.

1. Mix one (1) part Gym Floor Cleaner to four (4) parts water.
2. Place several large towels in a bucket and make sure that they are thoroughly wet.
3. Wring out towels until they are damp.
4. Wrap a towel around a broom and tack the floor until it is completely free of dirt and oil.
5. When the floor is dry, it is ready to screen.

NOTE: Use plenty of clean towels. Do not reuse towels unless they have been laundered.

DIRTY CLEANING SOLUTION AND DIRTY TOWELS SIMPLY REDEPOSIT OIL AND DIRT

FOR GENERAL MAINTENANCE CLEANING - GFC can be used to tack the floor to remove build-up of dust mop treatment or dirt. Follow the same procedures outlined for cleaning prior to recoating. Please refer to Excelsior's maintenance guides for more detailed instructions. If using an auto scrubber, a mixture of one (1) part GFC to nine (9) parts water is recommended.
